13U – 6-8

The Flames played in two SWOL Sub regional tournaments making the semi-finals in both of them with a combined record of three wins and one loss. Due to the weather, the semi-final and championship games were postponed. One of the games will be against the Butler County Bombers-Nationals (to be played on 5/5) and the other semi-final game will be against the Township Tornados (to be played on 5/18). With a win in either game, the Flames will get a spot to play on the SWOL Regional Championship (June 4-6).

The 12u Flames are 18 and 5 so far this season and have won all three tourneys they have participated in. Advantage Sports March Madness, King of Lakes, and the 13u Triple Crown Queen City Qualifier.
